STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL AND REFUND POLICY

The student has a right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. If the student's tuition is sponsored through outside sources or programs, the refund will be sent to the sponsoring agency. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
